I will report on several issues in these notes (some of them are updates).

Today begins Catholic Schools Week and students from St. Patrick's School are scheduled to speak briefly at all the Masses this weekend. In addition to the regular subjects of English, Math, Science, etc., our Catholic Schools teach Religion and incorporate our Catholic Faith throughout the curriculum. Of course, not everyone attends Catholic Schools but I have to say, especially in the world of today, they are a great blessing. I pray for all the children in Catholic Schools as well as in public schools. May all children come to know and love the faith which comes from Jesus. They are the future of the Church.
