Anointing of the Sick/Holy Communion for the Homebound

Contact a priest for ministry to the sick and aged at home or at a local healthcare facility. Upon request, Holy Communion will be brought to the seriously ill or homebound.

Confirmation

Baptized adults who have never received First Communion and/or Confirmation should contact a priest to complete their Christian Initiation through the R.C.I.A. process.

A Note about Becoming Sponsors For Baptism and Confirmation

Eucharistic Minister, Homebound Minister & Lector Training

For those who "signed up" at the ministry Fair last weekend, thank you for volunteering for one or more of these most important ministries. Shortly we will begin training sessions for Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass and to the Homebound. What's expected? A candidate must be Catholics at least 14 years of age to become a Lector / 18 years of age to become a Eucharistic Minister, having received First Holy Communion and Confirmation. The candidate must be leading a life of faith in keeping with the function to be assumed, not bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared, be reverential, respectful of his/her faith, and of good moral character; and if married, be in a valid marriage according to the law of the Catholic Church. Lectors should possess the necessary ability and talents to proclaim the Word of God in a clear, dignified, and effective manner. Extraordinary Ministers who will bring Holy Communion to the sick should be able to minister to the sick in a compassionate, prayerful, and sensitive way. They should possess psychological maturity and the ability to keep confidence, not discussing indiscriminately the condition of patients or their homes. **Any other parishioners who are interested in any of these ministries, please call the rectory.** Questions?
